






On The Road to Damascus... The Weekly Email Blast June 29, 2018

Offering Altar Flowers in Remembrance & Thanksgiving

At St. Paul's Episcopal Church, flowers are one of the ways that we can give thanks to God, remember, or simply help to beautify the church on Sundays. Do you want to give flowers to remember a loved one who has died; give thanks for a special intention, celebrate an anniversary, or any other important time or people in your life?

We are happy to have beautiful floral arrangements from Adams Fairacre Farms on Route 44 in Poughkeepsie during the year (except during Lent, Holy Week, and other more penitential liturgies) for the reasonable cost of \$35/week for both arrangements that are set behind the altar. Donors are invited to take the flowers after the second Sunday service, to share them among those attending the services that day, with someone sick, or someone home-bound.

Please sign up for your desired donation date on the flower chart in the <u>Narthex</u>* of the church. If the date you wish to designate your offering is already filled in on the flower chart, please speak to Mother Megan. *All shall be well.*

Additionally, our weekly flowers are picked up and delivered by members of our <u>Flower Delivery Ministry Team</u>. Is this team a ministry you feel called to join? *<u>Narthex</u>: an enclosed space at the entry end of the nave of a church; the area just inside the front door.

**<u>Nave</u>: the main part of a church; the place where the congregation sits. Derived from an old word for ship; in older churches the beams of the roof resembled the beams and timbers in the sides of a ship.

From the Book of Common Prayer, page 820: Prayers for National Life Independence Day, July 4th

For our Country:

Almighty God, who hast given us this good land for our heritage: We humbly beseech thee that we may always prove ourselves a people mindful of thy favor and glad to do thy will. Bless our land with honorable industry, sound learning, and pure manners. Save us from violence, discord, and confusion; from pride and arrogance, and from every evil way. Defend our liberties, and fashion into one united people the multitudes brought hither out of many kindreds and tongues. Endue with the spirit of wisdom those to whom in thy Name we entrust the authority of government, that there may be justice and peace at home, and that, through obedience to thy law, we may show forth thy praise among the nations of the earth. In the time of prosperity, fill our hearts with thankfulness, and in the day of trouble, suffer not our trust in thee to fail; all which we ask through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

When is a Bishop coming to Visit Us?

We find out the Bishop Visitation Schedule in the Fall of every year for the following calendar year - so stay tuned for more information as soon as we receive it!

From the website of the Episcopal Diocese of New York:

Episcopal Visitations: An official visit by one of our bishops is and should be a significant event in the life of any congregation. **The bishops are outward and visible signs of the Episcopal ethos, which makes us Episcopalians and which**

binds the tens of thousands of us in ten counties together as the Episcopal Diocese of New York, an identity in mission transcending parish bounds.

The sacraments of initiation – *baptism and confirmation* – are customary at the time of visitation, but not necessary. Parishioners can also be presented for *reception* into the Episcopal Church and to *reaffirm* their faith.

The bishop will also want to meet with the vestry, and to review the books in which the parish records of baptisms, marriages, confirmations and burials are recorded.

(Do you ever wonder why the ushers count how many of us are present and write the number on a slip of paper that goes on the top of the offering plate? It's because we keep a record of all of our services of worship and share our information with our bishop when they visit...we also submit this information for diocesan record keeping...AND it's helpful to make sure we have enough bread and wine for everyone present if it's a Eucharistic service!).

What is an Episcopalian?

From the website of the Episcopal Diocese of New York:

The Episcopal Church is a member of the world-wide Anglican Communion, with 70 million members in 164 countries. We are a community of Christians bound together by our belief that Holy Scripture contains the very core of all Christian faith and thought, by the many ancient and modern stories that connect us to Jesus and his teachings, and by discovering daily God's hope and call to us through our life together. The precise beliefs and practices of Episcopalians can be a puzzle to those raised in more rigid traditions—and even sometimes to Episcopalians themselves! We are not fully protestant, but at the same time are not Roman Catholic either. We offer no unquestioning obedience to a central authority-instead debating doctrine among ourselves and often agreeing to differ on it. Yet we also have splendidly dressed bishops and priests and deacons, just as the Roman Catholics do (except, of course, that many of ours are women, and our senior bishops are all elected), and we center our worship on the Eucharist, or Holy Communion. The connections that bind us can sometimes get lost in the smoke of debate, but they are there nonetheless, have deep historical roots, and are much more powerful than they sometimes seem.

[This section of our site attempts to describe those connections, and to bring together information and resources that will help both members and non-members of the Episcopal Church understand more about our shared beliefs and practices: where

we are coming from, and where we are going. It also includes practical information regarding the policies of the Diocese and of the wider Episcopal Church on who may take communion in an Episcopal Church, on what defines Church "membership," and on Baptisms, Confirmations, Marriages and Funerals.]

To date we have received \$70 in donations plus some cases of soda and water. We still need more. PVW may seem a long way off, but it's coming quicker than it feels.

This year we are also asking for cased donations of bottled water, Arizona Green Tea (plastic bottles please) Apple juice and CASH to purchase soda, peppers, onions, celery, mayonnaise and lemons. We will be selling the soda for \$2.00, and canned soda is too small so we need to stay competitive and offer larger bottled soda which is usually more expensive.

We need:


