

Outreach Ministry Update: The Seamen's Church Institute of NY & NJ

Two years ago, St. Paul's started a collection for the Seamen's Church Institute, an organization rooted in The Episcopal Church that provides education, pastoral care and legal advocacy to the merchant mariners who deliver to our shores many of the products that we use every day. They sponsor a program called "Christmas at Sea" that provides these seafarers such items as phone cards and personal toiletries. The centerpiece of the Christmas gifts are hand kitted hats and scarves.

Kay Saderholm and others have been knitting hats and scarves for several months. I would again like to collect some of the other items to send down to the Mission. Some of the items that they would appreciate are:

- · Unscented, colorless lip balm
- Unscented, Hypoallergenic hand lotion (2-4 oz bottles)
- · Sealed packages of holiday sweets
- Chocolate candy bars
- Books or activities like word search, playing cards & especially Sudoku
- · Facial tissue
- · Microwave popcorn
- · Chewing gum
- · Handmade Christmas cards

All items must be in new and unused condition and in their original packaging.

Please do not donate any medicinal items such as aspirin or the like.

As an additional note, this will be the last year that we will be collecting for SCI. Kay and I would like to thank everyone who donated items, who supported us and especially those who knitted the beautiful scarves and hats and who put together the ditty bags. St. Paul's (our little church that could) has far exceeded my wildest dreams when we began this charity two years ago.
