


## THE SEARCH COMMITTEE

**Carpenter's Kids** This is the final year of our 8 year commitment to support 67 children in Chamwino, Tanzania. Because of your gifts, each child was able to receive a new uniform, a pair of shoes, some much-needed school supplies, and soap for the year. Each child was fed breakfast everyday they attended school.

Many of our children have gone on to more expensive secondary education or vocational training. Our current cost is \$70 per child and almost half of the money for this year has already been received. We need to have all donations in by July 15th. 

# CONFIRMATION, RECEPTION, RE-AFFIRMATION

## What is Confirmation?

Confirmation is a pastoral rite in the Episcopal Church, which means it is a rite that notes some fuller initiation into the Church, the Body of Christ. A person is a full member of the Church through Baptism. Confirmation, as defined in The Book of Common Prayer is "a mature public affirmation of faith and commitment to the responsibilities of Baptism." At Confirmation, an individual receives the laying on of hands by the bishop, thereby affirming their own faith and visibly connecting to the broader Body of Christ.



## What is the difference between Confirmation, Reaffirmation, and Reception?

**Confirmation** is "a mature and public affirmation of faith and commitment to the responsibilities of Baptism" (BCP).

**Reaffirmation** means that you choose to re-state your commitment to Christ in The Episcopal Church, honoring your growth in faith throughout your spiritual journey. For many people, their path has wandered in and out of various denominations. Reaffirmation honors their journey and their previous public commitment as an adult while also making this definitive sacramental gesture.

**Reception** is common for people who have been active throughout their lives in other denominations. Often, individuals who made a public profession of faith in a faith tradition such as the Baptist Church will choose to be Received into The Episcopal Church.

## Getting Ready for the Bishop, October 6, 2013

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## THE COLUMBARIUM

The Columbarium is a ministry of Saint Paul's Episcopal Church in Pleasant Valley, New York. It is established in our cemetery to foster a sense of closeness to the St. Paul's community even after death. Parish members, family and friends have been buried here since the 1840. This is a sacred place where those who grieve may come to find comfort and support through prayer and peaceful reflection.

It is hoped the Columbarium will provide an economical and ecological alternative to interment in our traditional cemetery plots. The Columbarium Committee understands the difficulty faced by grieving family members and therefore has tried to simplify this process. To that end we encourage people to plan in advance but realize that this is not always possible.

Our goal is to provide parishioners and friends with a contemporary solution to interment that continues in the historical tradition of Saint Paul's 170 year old cemetery.
