

From the rector: Living the first, and preparing for the second week of Advent

Welcome to the end of the first week of Advent, people of St. Paul's! I'm looking forward to Sunday and to continuing our walk together toward the Incarnation at Christmas. Following Jesus of Nazareth is always an ADVENTure. When I think about adventures, I think about shoes. Proper footwear can help any adventurer. And when I think about shoes, I think about feet. The people I know and have known throughout the course of my life feel differently about pedicures. I love to talk about pedicures. It's not always pretty, but much about life isn't the kind of pretty that this culture would want photographed and published in a magazine. Still, I'm going to talk about pedicures. Many people I know don't like them. Some have not experienced them. Of those folks, some are not thinking about it, some would like to try one and others have not had one on purpose. And some people love them. I am one of those people. I love the whole thing. No matter how fresh, relieved and relaxed my feet feel after having intentional attention paid to them, I seem to forget about that relief and

relaxation until the very moment I make time to get one again. I wonder if any or all of you reading this can identify with my experience...

For me, this short vignette about pedicures has become somewhat of a life metaphor. A human life is an amazing thing to have. There are days when I feel more aware of this gift of my life, and there are days when I am less aware. I would like to tell you more about those latter days, but I don't recall very much about them because of my lack of intentional awareness living through them. Anyway, here we are, and here's what I want to share with you: we are human beings and we live in human bodies. During this season of Advent, I have felt invited by God through the person of Jesus to reflect on what it means to live an embodied life. A life where I pay attention to little things that really aren't so little, and things that seem big, too. The living God comes among us as a human being in a human body at Christmas. What can we receive from God's gift of humanity and our own? What does living in a human body among other humans living in bodies give us access or insight in to that we can use to connect to one another? Or divide from one another? What does it mean to you and to us to reflect on any of these thoughts and questions?

I'll be praying for us and with you along the way to Christmas. Remember where your feet are. Literally and/or figuratively. I am present when I am where my feet are.

And I am grateful for this life and to be walking in and through it with all of you.
